City of Berkeley Environmental Initiatives

Berkeley integrates environmental, social, land use, and economic policies for a sustainable, healthy city. Land use policies since the 1950's encourage in-fill, mixed-use development, including industry, which helps maintain an economically and ethnically diverse community. Compact development supports non-auto transportation—walking, bicycling and mass transit.

The Office of Economic Development's Environmental Economy Program attracts businesses that provide environmental goods and services and/or embrace environmentally responsible practices. The goal is to establish Berkeley as the center of the nation's "Green Valley."

Berkeley is one of the few cities in the State with its own Toxics Management Office, which promotes substitution of non-toxic products in business and industry.

The City Energy Office promotes energy conservation and renewable energy and is implementing a greenhouse gas reduction plan. Berkeley developed ReEnergize East Bay, funded by the U.S. Department of Energy to build energy efficiency and reduce utility expenses in the East Bay, in partnership with Oakland, Emeryville, PG&E, the Community Energy Services Corporation, Lawrence Berkeley Laboratories and business representatives.

Berkeley banned the use of ozone depleting products, such as styrofoam cups, and instituted a green purchasing program.

The Berkeley-Oakland Recycling Market Development Zone is among the most successful in the State in attracting recycling and other environmental businesses. Berkeley was the first in the country to have a curbside recycling program. Integrated Waste Management's innovative programs support pre-cycling, reuse, and recycling:

- Pre-cycle campaign encourages citizens to buy reusable, minimally packaged products.
- Recycling containers are cemented on top of litter containers citywide.
- Backyard composting units are available for households.
- Markets and restaurants take part in a food waste composting project.
- Transfer station staff salvages items for resale.

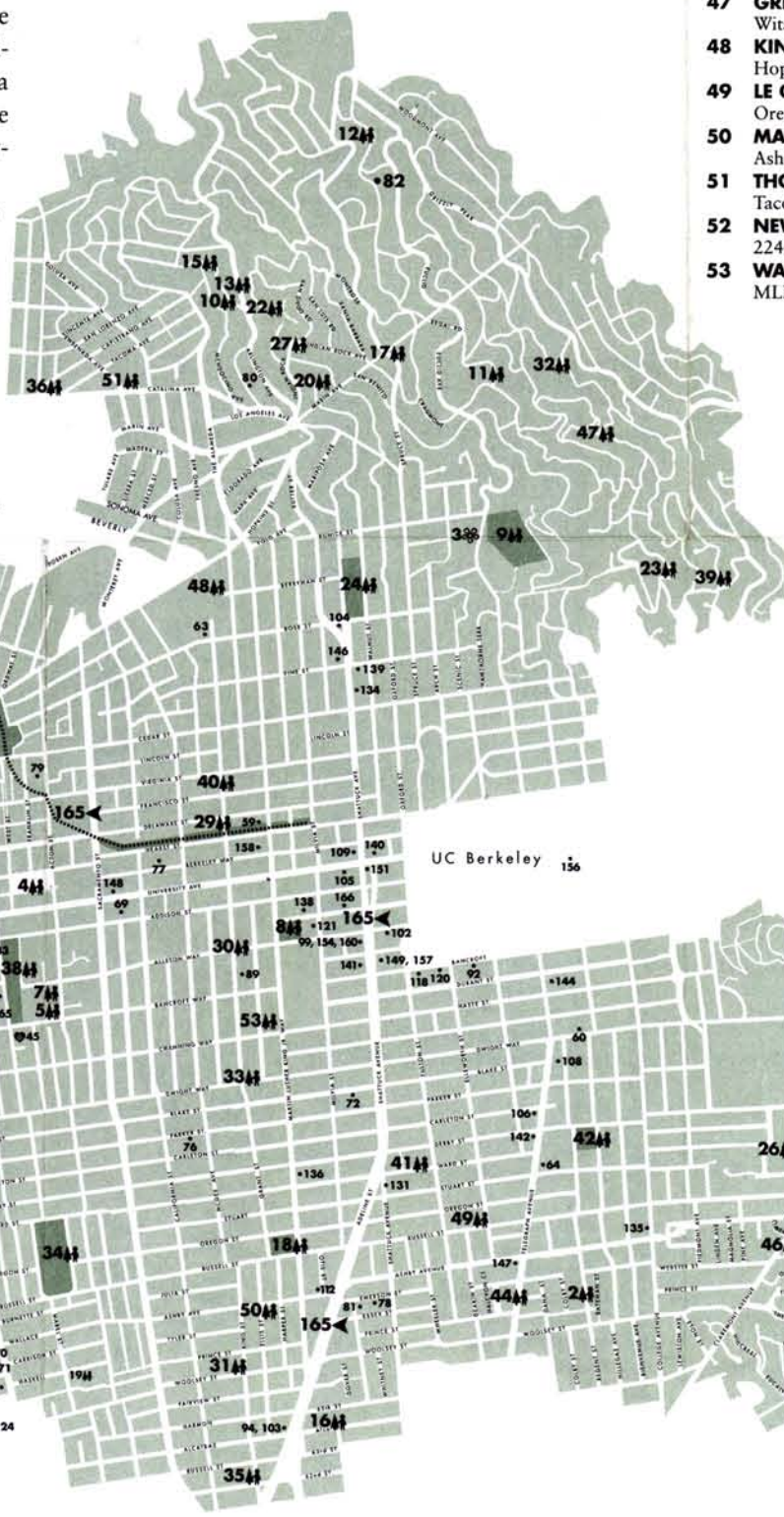
