Conferences are a great opportunity to network, connect, build community, learn, get resources and keep alive friendships with FTMs from all over the world. FTMI salutes the dedicated organizers who plan and execute the conferences behind the scenes all year long. A tremendous amount of effort goes into making a successful conference. Many conferences that welcome and include FTMs are held throughout the year. Here we are highlighting two conferences of special significance to the leadership of our community, the first annual Transgender Religious Leaders Summit held in Berkeley bringing together FTM and MTF spiritual leaders and the second annual California Transgender Leadership Summit held in Los Angeles. California is often the testing ground for legislation and advocacy that becomes national and international policy.

The special feature of this issue is an FTM conference breaking new ground, the first to be held in the heartland, FORGE Forward 2007. The hard work of this conference is being done by a committed team led by the co-founders of FORGE, which has been serving FTMs for more than 13 years. FTMI awarded a \$5000 grant to FORGE Forward 2007 and we encourage all FTMI members to participate in this great conference. We also

are introducing our new board members, Zander, Deborah and Lyle who are bring their talents and experience to their leadership positions. They serve alongside Executive Board member Mr. Alexander Yoo MA MFTi who is our treasurer. Alexander brings his expertise in the WPATH Standards of Care as a community service provider to the board. He is the Editor of the FTMI Newsletter and moderator of the FTM_International list, the FTM-International_Discussion list and the FTM_International_AFLOAT list. He is a leader in many transgender causes. Alexander's speaking engagements include The Transgender Youth Symposium (2002), USCB (2002), Project Angel Food (2004), Trans Unity Pride (2003-2006), Transgender Day of Remembrance (2003-2006), CSLA (2003-2006), UCLA (2003-2006), Antioch University (2003-2006), CSUN (2005), CSUCI (2005), College of the Canyons (2005), Alpha Chapter Tri-Ess (2005) and the California Transgender Leadership Summit (2006-2007). He is a Trans Unity Pride (2002-2006) Executive Board Member, 2003's Recipient of the Pride Award ("FTM of the Year") and 2005's Recipient of the Excellence Award as President of GQR. Alexander was among the winners of the TSELF scholarship. As an Asian person of color immigrant he is proud to represent people of color, people of faith and people of gender and cultural diversity on the board of FTMI.

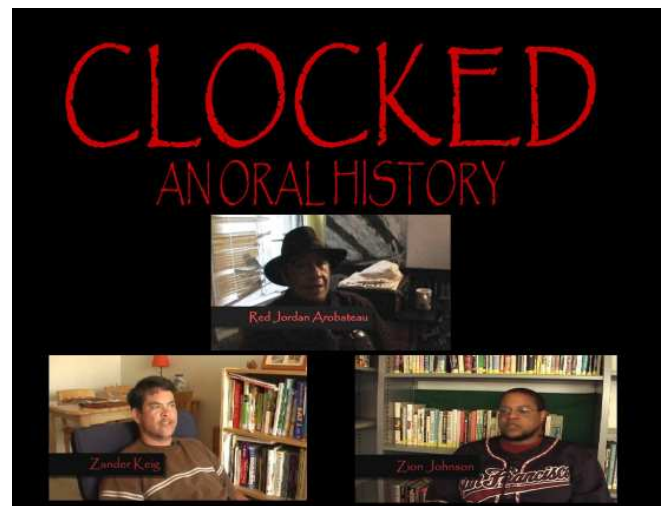

Transgender Religious Leaders Summit

Newsweek: Gender and the Pulpit

Jan. 23, 2007 - Transgender spiritual leaders gathered in the hills of Berkeley, CA Jan. 19-21, for the first National Transgender Religious Summit. The conference was a joint project of the National Center for Transgender Equality (NCTE) in Washington, D.C. and the Pacific School of Religion. Sixty-five religious leaders attended, from Lutheran, Episcopalian, Presbyterian, Unitarian, Quaker, Jewish and Agnostic communities across the country. On the agenda: denominational policy and outreach to transgender communities.

Conference organizers think the time is right for transgendered persons of faith to come out of the closet. "Transgendered people are beginning to find their public voice with more advocates and opportunities for protection," explains Justin Tanis, an ordained FTM minister who helped put together the summit. "To the eunuchs who keep my Sabbaths, who choose the things that please me and

hold fast my covenant, I will give, in my house and within my walls, a monument and a name better than songs and daughters; I will give them an everlasting name that shall not be cut off." (Isaiah 56:1-5).

Transgendered people say another difficulty is that many religious denominations reinforce gender stereotypes—conventions about women's and men's roles in the life of a church, for example, that pose problems for people who want to live outside those rules. "The Bible has been used incorrectly throughout history to justify slavery and to oppress women," says Joshua Holiday, a female-to-male pastor at the LIFE (Love Is For EveryBODY) Interfaith Church in Louisville, Ky. A year and a half ago, Holiday co-organized a gathering of African-American transgendered people, The Transsistahs, Transbrothahs Conference (TSTB), to promote greater acceptance in the black community.

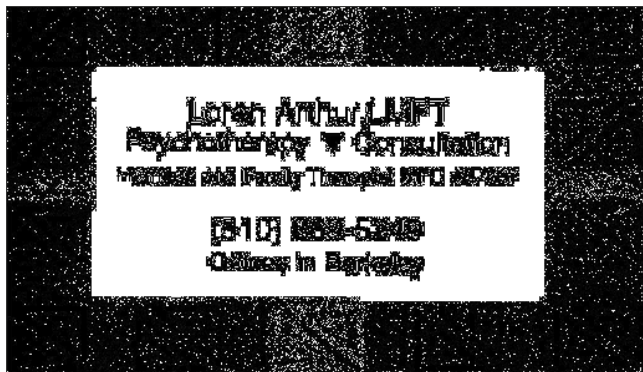
Religion, says Tanis, "is about compassion and human dignity"; he hopes the seminar will teach transgendered clergy to embrace their uncommon situation and use it for good. After going through his own transition, he says: "I had a greater sense of internal peace; I was wiser and could be a better religious leader. It is a gift to be able to see the world through more than one gender's eyes."

Among the presenters were Rev. Justin Tanis, program director of the National Center for Transgender Equality, Rev. Cameron Partridge, an Episcopal priest and doctoral student at Harvard Divinity School, and Reuben Zellman, a rabbinical student from Oakland, CA.

Religious discrimination - Outright discrimination from religious leaders was a major concern for conference attendees. Rev. Justin Tanis outlined some of the religious right's discriminatory statements about transgender people, including their false claims that transgender people can be "cured" of non-conforming gender expression. The objections of right-wing religious leaders were discussed as a significant roadblock to public legislation protecting the rights of transgender people. "Whenever you have a media account of a legislature considering a non-discrimination policy for transgender people, there's always fifty people to speak out in favor and one against, and the one against always has "Reverend" in front of their name," said Rabbi Levi Alter. "Well we're all reverends here, so where are we? We need to let them know that we [ordained transgender religious leaders and allies] aren't just a fringe voice. We are leaders who have the support of our denominations."

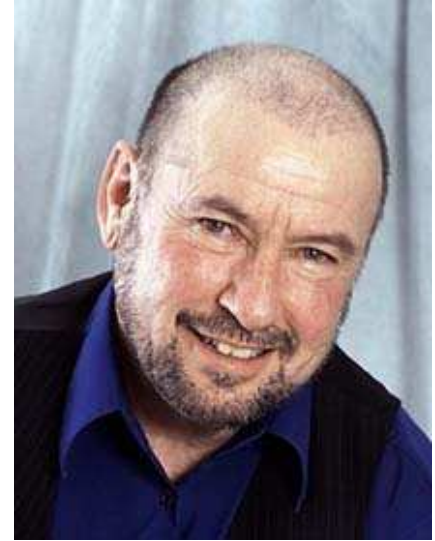

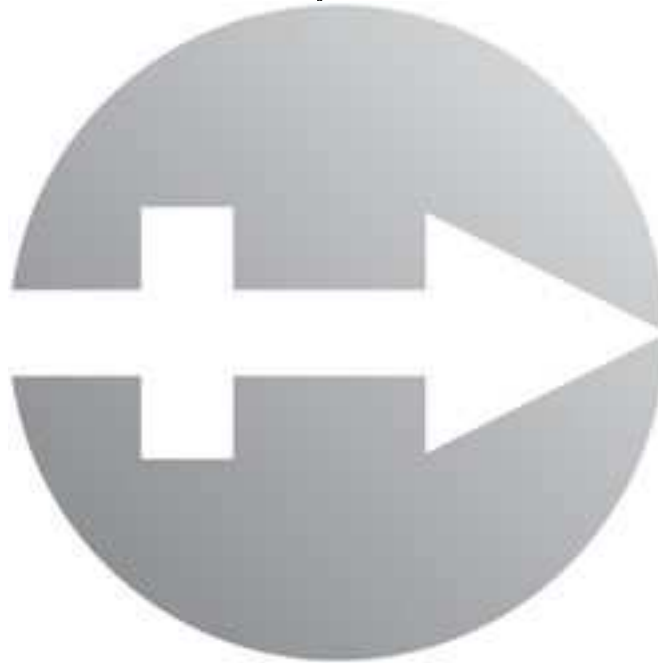

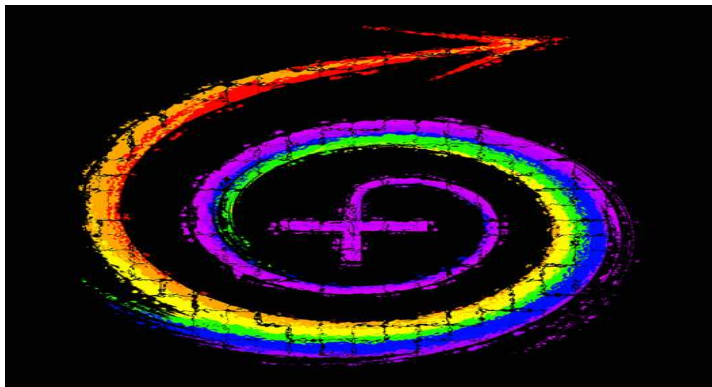

“We’ve met on the West Coast. We’ve met on the East Coast. We’ve met in small groups at larger conferences in Atlanta and Philadelphia and elsewhere, but never before have hundreds of those of us on the transmasculine spectrum and SOFFAs (Significant Others, Friends, Family, and Allies) invaded Middle America – until now!” announced michael munson and Loree Cook-Daniels, co-founder of FORGE, an FTM organization entering its 13th year.

On March 29 – April 1, 2007, the “heartland” city of Milwaukee, Wisconsin is playing host to the FORGE Forward 2007 Conference and Intensives. One of the most ambitious transmasculine/ SOFFA conferences to date, the event offers nine full-day pre-conference “Intensives” focusing on specific topics in addition to 2-1/2 days’ worth of plenary keynote speeches and entertainment, a film festival, authors’ readings, a vendor hall, a dance, and nearly 90 planned and propose-it-on-the-spot workshops and caucuses.

“FTMInternational has provided a \$5,000 grant to help get the word out about FORGE Forward 2007 to our community,” stated Rabbi Levi Alter, President of Female-to-Male International.

The FORGE Forward 2007 Conference and Intensives are designed not only to give individuals the information they seek, but also to build our community. To that end, all official programming is open to people of all identities. The Conference’s co-chairs, michael munson and Loree Cook-Daniels, have made efforts to recruit participation by LGB and mainstream Midwesterners, in order to raise trans awareness. Scholarships have been provided by the Greater Milwaukee Foundation’s Johnson and Pabst LGBT Humanity Fund and Robert J. Stark and Fredric A. Thompson Fund.

101 Topics

For those who are dealing with transition issues and questions, a whole set of workshops go over the basics: do’s and don’ts of hormone use, finding a therapist, safe injection techniques, hysterectomy and vaginectomy, evaluating the quality of information on trans-oriented and other websites, and presentations by five surgeons who specialize in FTM-related top and/ or bottom surgeries (Brassard, Brownstein, Meltzer, Reardon, and Steinwald). Many of these surgeons will also offer free, onsite, individual consultations for prospective clients. There will also be both top and bottom surgery show-and-tells so that people can see what various procedures “look like in the flesh,” and get feedback from previous clients of various surgeons. There will also be an open “ask the doctor” panel to address medical questions that don’t fall under the standard workshop topics, or that cut across multiple issues. There’s also a discussion forum for learning about FTM, genderqueer and designated male-at-birth bodies.

Beyond body modification issues, the “basics” include a workshop discussing identities and labels and what’s “forever,” transitioning with a third gender identity, living as a gay or bi man, navigating out-versus-stealth decisions in a post-9/11 world, and an open legal question and answer panel. Although as mentioned, SOFFAs and SOFFA issues are welcome and integrated throughout all workshops, we have set

aside caucus space specifically (but not exclusively) for partners of those who have only recently begun talking about gender issues and/or transitioning. Here all of your emotions and questions are welcome.

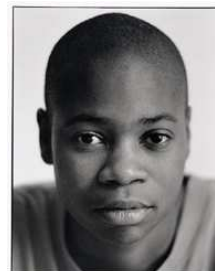

Our Complex Identities

In keeping with the Conference’s theme, “Honoring Our Complexities,” there are many offerings and discussions about identities other than gender. Spiritual issues will be addressed in Conference workshops on “Jewish genders” and an interfaith dialogue with FTMI President Rabbi Levi Alter, Shai Wise and Jamie Washam. We’ll also screen the films “Call Me Malcolm,” about an FTM minister, and “The Believers,” about a trans gospel choir. Imani Henry will be addressing multiple identity issues in his performance art at the Saturday night plenary.

Advancing Our Community

The FORGE Forward 2007 Conference and Intensives has a strong track of programming dedicated to helping community members increase their advocacy and organizing skills. Mara Keisling of the National Center for Transgender Equality, Lisa Mottet of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force, and Cole Thaler of the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund are sponsoring a series of workshops related to Real ID and other legal and advocacy issues, including one entitled, “The End of Stealth: Living Trans in the 21st Century.” There are two presentations by experts on using medical ethics and evidence-based medicine and other methods to leverage health care insurance coverage for trans people, and two on taking more consumer control of health care. Our bias awareness and reduction series includes an anti-racism caucus. There are skills-development classes in techniques for transgender awareness presentations, creating speakers bureaus, and working with homeless shelters, prisons, youth organizations, and feminist communities. Of course we’ll be addressing diagnostic reform and GID, too!

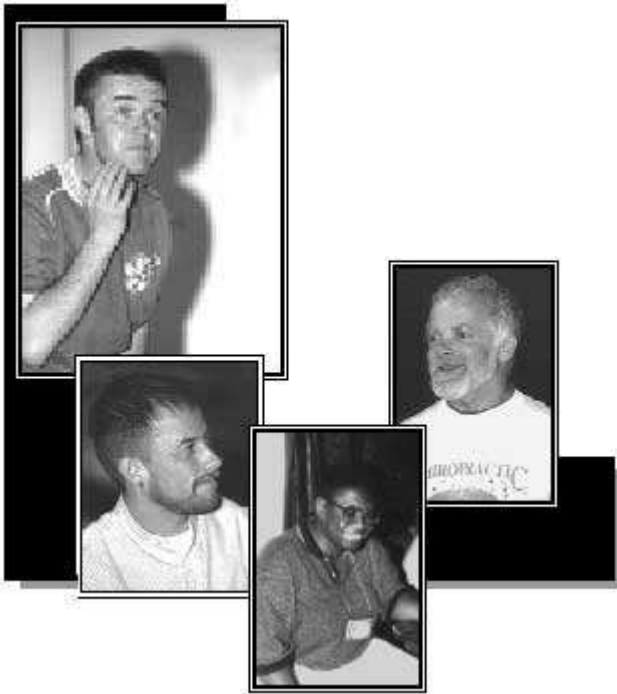

FTMI's FTM Conference of the Americas in 1995 was the first conference that got the ball rolling.



From the seed of this first conference came great FTM conferences in 1996 and 1997, the True Spirit conference series and the Gender Odyssey series.

The organizer of this year's Transgender Religious Leadership Summit in Berkeley was the Rev. Dr. Justin Tanis, who was on the organizing committee of the Forward Motion Conference in 1999 in Burbank, CA, which was also the genesis of the organization FTM Alliance of Los Angeles.

Justin was one of a number of prominent FTM leaders who served on the board of directors of FTM International from other cities, notably Los Angeles.

The organizing committee of the 1999 Forward Motion conference in Burbank, one of the most ambitious of the early conferences. Past FTMI board members Mr. Jeff Shevlowitz, founder of the oldest FTM support group, Under Construction, in Los Angeles which was the model three years later for Lou Sullivan's FTM group in San Francisco (which became FTM International), the Rev. Dr. Justin Tanis and Professor Jacob Hale PhD were on the committee along with FTMI members Masen Davis MSW the President of FTM Alliance of Los Angeles and Patric Magee MSW the President of Orange County FTM and other FTM leaders.



Rev. Justin Tanis is the author of *Transgendered: Theology, Ministry and Communities of Faith* and contributed to the *Queer Bible Commentary* and *Take Back the Word: A Queer Reading of the Bible*. He earned his Master's Degree from Harvard Divinity School and a doctorate from San Francisco Theological Seminary. For fifteen years, he worked for Metropolitan Community Churches, serving as a pastor in Boston, Honolulu and San Francisco before becoming the Director of Leadership Development for the international denomination. He works with the National Center for Transgender Equality as Program Manager, creating publications, resources, and newsletters. Some of his recent projects include:

- Making Your Voice Heard: A Transgender Guide to Educating Congress
- Responding to Hate Crimes: A Community Resource Manual
- A House Party kit for grassroots fundraising
- NCTE's newsletters

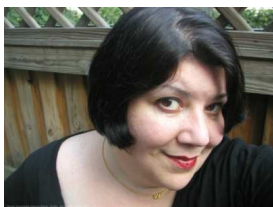
Currently he is working on *Teaching Transgender*, a resource for leading Transgender 101 trainings, as well as co-authoring a guide for LGBT organizations seeking to become more trans-inclusive. He is also responsible for NCTE's 2007 campaign to highlight human rights issues for transgender people through a monthly calendar. Justin is the editor and designer of the *Leather Times*, the newsletter of the Leather Archives & Museum and is a columnist with *Power Exchange* magazine.

This in turn not only helps build a stronger community and political movement, but also helps individuals feel less isolated, misunderstood, and under siege."

Genderqueer and femme programming: " Those possibilities will be well-explored during the four days. An all-day Intensive on Friday, March 30, "Beyond the Binary: Language, Longing, and Legitimacy," will provide many tools for participants to use in thinking through and creating not only the identities but also the communities we want. Other workshops addressing non-binary issues include: examining and combating hierarchies and divisions with gender variant communities, battling the trans enough blues, and or moving from F to M to F or beyond. Butch performance artist S. Bear Bergman will present hir acclaimed performance piece, "Clearly Marked," at Friday night's opening plenary. For those who identify predominately as femme, regardless of gender, Hanne Blank and Jessica Eve Humphrey are facilitating the day-long "All This And Cute Shoes Too: Femme Beyond Binaries" Intensive on Friday. During the Conference itself, on Saturday, there will also be a femme identities workshop, and we'll be showing the provocative and funny new film, "Female to Femme," that includes a "femme transition support group."

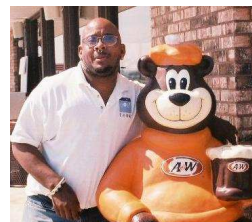

Cross-cutting oppressions and connections: " March 30th's Intensives include "Breaking Isolation, Building Community: A Gathering for Disabled and Deaf People and Our Allies," facilitated by Eli Clare and Sebastian Margaret and "Building Multi-Racial, Multi-Gender, Anti-Racist, Anti-Capitalist Trans Organizations, Coalitions and Movements," led by Dean Spade and staff of the Sylvia Rivera Law Project. In a mark of just how far we've come, we've even got a workshop on transgender characters in young adult fiction!"
