Nuclear Power Plants The Atomic Energy Commission of Canada Ltd. has now made two visits to this area to promote the advantages of nuclear energy as a source of power. Many scientists, however, feel that the dangers of radioactive and thermal pollution are great and are demanding a five year moratorium on nuclear power plants. Dr. Lamont C. Cole, President of the American Institute of Biological Scientists, says "I am convinced that this rush to blanket the Northeast with nuclear power plants is one of the most dangerous and misguided steps ever taken by man." On April 17 Dr. John Gofman, eminent scientist with the American Atomic Energy Commission, will speak on the hazards nuclear power plants present to man and the environment. Bring as many people as you can to hear a renowned scientist speak out on this crucial and controversial question. The meeting will be at 8 p.m. in MacLaurin 144 at U. Vic.

Of Lettuces & Daffodils Because of your sympathy, the grape boycott was won. Grapeworkers now have: wash basins, toilets, drinking water; a ban on all hard pesticides dangerous to consumers, to workers or to the environment; an end to child labour; a stable wage (\$2.10/hr.); job security. Now lettuce workers in Salinas, California have been on strike five months, asking for these same humane improvements. 10,000 lettuce workers ask your support. Please help. Ask your grocer for Farmworkers' Union label lettuce (NOT Teamsters).

Daffodil pickers at Vantreight farm here in Victoria are trying to get decent conditions and a decent wage. Working from 8 - 5 p.m. in all types of weather and mud with only a half hour break for lunch, they receive pay from .90/hr. to a maximum of \$1.10/hr. for women, a maximum of \$1.35/hr. for men. Help boycott this year's harvest.
