This year is the 30th anniversary of VOW birth! A celebration is planned for the fall in Ottawa or Toronto.

The world has changed in 30 years; in the beginning VOW was a clear but lonely voice for global survival; in recent years-thanks to our work, in part- we have had more company.

The last two years have seen great changes in Eastern Europe, the start of change in S. Africa, little change elsewhere.

The new situation in the Warsaw countries and major disarmament initiatives confirm the value of our years of work. While the response of Canadians and other NATO citizens has been great welcome and relief, our governments still act with mistrust and fear of change.

There has been no substantial reduction in Canadian military spending, we still have troops in W. Europe, we still support a major armaments industry that supplies Canada and USA military and increasingly exports to the developing world. Canada does not condemn USA military aggression in Central America, we still test Cruise missiles and support NATO low level tests flights over our land and the establishment of a major NATO training base in Labrador.

VOW has much work to do; our goal of a war free of war and violence must be realized. We need to relate the imperative of global militarization by the industrial nothern world of the rest of the globe to resource depletion, social oppression and environmental destruction. VOW has the experience and information to relate these issues to our situation locally and nationally as well as in the rest of the world. We need to work for the end of military structures and all that they represent -elitism, inequality, secrecy and threat-and ensure that the military are not given a new facade for domination in the form of the' war on drugs' or saving the environment. We need to work to create new democratic social movements that will include all citizens in the process of creating a peaceful, just and healthy environment for all the world!

Enclosed is a summary of our activities in 1989- another busy year!
