HAPPENBACH.	8th.		Permission was given by Brigade for the Battalion to move forward to the UDENBRATH AREA in order to shorten our march for the following day. The Battalion moved off at 1230 hours. The country in this district is very barren being heavily wooded and but few houses. Billets were reached about 1800 hours.	0.0. 76.
UDENBRATH.	9th.		Battalion moved at 0900 hours to KALL. The country en route is more settled and we seem to have left the mountainous district and are now in a farming area. Billets which were quite good were reached at 1700 hours. We have had no further trouble re rations for the last few days.	00. 76.
KALL.	10th.		The Battalion moved to EUSKIRCHEN, a fairly large manufacturing town, the whole Battalion being billeted in the Barracks of the 28th. German Infantry Regiment. The accomodation and all ranks were able to get a good hot bath.	00 78 77

EUSKIRCHEN.	Dec. 11.		The advance was continued to KIERBERG? the country being chiefly manufacturing and soft coal mining. The people seem most curious, we apparently being the first Highland Battalion to pass through. There does not appear to be any very great signs of lack of food in the country, though clothing seems to be bad. Billets were reached about 1500 hours.	O.O. 78. f.
KIERBERG.	12.		The Battalion marched to the Rondkirchen area, a suburb of Cologne, arrangements having been made for the 1st Canadian Division to cross the RHINE at 0930 hours on the 13th. We arrived in billets at Noon and all ranks spent the rest of the day preparing for the triumphal march through the city.	O.O. 79. f.
RONDKIRCHEN	13.		THE BRITISH ARMIES CROSSED THE RHINE. The 3rd. Brigade led the 1st Canadian Division. Lots were drawn for the place of honour in the Brigade and was won by the 14th Battalion followed by the 15th., 16th. and 13th Battalions. The Division started to cross the New Bridge simultaneously with the 29th. Division on the Hohenzollern Bridge at 0930 hours. The Battalions marched with fixed bayonets and Band playing. The Battalion never looked better, the spirits of the men being fine. We marched through the streets approaching the Bridge, at ease, all ranks singing. In spite of heavy rain there was quite a large crowd of Huns on the streets, who looked on silently. It must have been a great humiliation for them to have our troops marching through their streets unhindered. The Battalion crossed the Rhine at 1000 hours to the tune of the "Cock of the North.". It was a most impressive sight which will be long remembered by all. The Divisional Commander was at the Eastern approach to the bridge and received the salute as the Battalion passed. The Brigade continued the march to take up its position in the Bridgehead. The 16th. Battalion was billeted in HEUMAR becoming Brigade Reserve.	O.O. 80 f.
