

The Gay and Lesbian TV Guide



I'm one of those "TV generation" people. Thirty-nine, male, grew up on the Flintstones, the Partridge Family, Scooby Doo, and Gilligan's Island. I know my TV shows and have been jaded by the boob tube. Now it's that time of year when the networks trot out the new shows and woo us all into a winter's worth of couch potato-hood. So I started to think about gay characters I've noticed over the years.

Admittedly, I don't watch "Will and Grace" (except every once in a while); and I only watched part of one episode of "Normal" - the short-lived series with John Goodman. And I watched "Ellen" until she wasn't funny anymore. I'm not likely to watch Ellen in her new series because she already lost me in the last one. (Alright, I'll try it out a couple of times and at least give her a shot)

Gay and lesbian characters have certainly made their mark on the television landscape (except on Star Trek where apparently they've solved that whole gay thing). We never used to be on TV except through Paul Lynd on Hollywood Squares or the questionable sexuality of Charles Nelson Riley. Then there was Martin Mull and Sandra Bernhardt on Roseanne which was a huge leap

forward (although the famous kiss was upsettingly anti-climactic). So, on the one hand we've come a long way in being an open and visible presence in TV land, the most consumable North American product.

On the other hand, I think that simply being gay doesn't make a character funny or worth watching. Camp has always been funny (to some). In the case of Will and Grace, Will is offset by Jack (the male ingénue vs. the campy fag). But I think the caustic secretary Karen is much funnier and has better lines. The show hasn't grabbed my attention though, I got tired of the 'gay' thing. Ellen battled to be openly lesbian on her series and for a brief and shining moment she was queen. But after that everything was 'lesbian' this and 'gay' that and it wasn't funny. Earlier shows had better scripts and story lines that didn't rely on Ellen's sexuality and weren't trying to make a point. Which was good, because it's TV comedy and there isn't supposed to be a point.

The zany antics in sitcom life are what make it funny, not the sexual orientation of a character. Gay men and lesbians aren't funny because they're gay or lesbian. If that were true we'd be laughing all the time (ha). What's funny is the situation in which the characters are placed and their reaction to it (and the laugh track if they have one). Being constantly reminded that a character is gay or lesbian – with no context to a joke – for me is excruciatingly dull.

Perhaps I'm missing all the humor in Will and Grace, and perhaps I'm just not up on the hip-ness of Ellen and I need to get with the times, but I don't think I'll be glued to any show out of duty to my political label and I won't be convinced that a gay or lesbian life is any funnier than a straight one when it comes to tv.

I don't think it will matter much to people like Ellen - well... she's rich and famous and doesn't know who I am.

People called out our names (we had taken a cheering section with us) and it was exciting. George found a dry parking space for us, and we were happy to change out of our wet clothes. Some of us splashed around the festival afterwards, but we were running out of dry clothes. We all had a great day and were happy to head home singing much of the way, as is typical of Musaic. Thanks to all that supported us. We are already planning for next year. Special thanks to Pat Ford for her fund raising efforts with her rainbow bracelets.

Alexandra Tydings ... The Goddess of Love

Alexandra Tydings is moving on. After 5 years of playing Aphrodite on both *Hercules: The Legendary Journey* and *Xena: Warrior Princess*, she is moving on to a new series that she cocreated with Babylon 5's Claudia Christian and that she hopes to see in Production this fall. We caught up with the beaitiful and charming actress at the First annual Victoria Comic Book and Sci-Fi Convention and got the skinny on subtext, her new series and a music video called *Taboo*.

LR: Tell us about Hourglass.

AT: It is about these two women who grew up together, are very close and always wanted to travel to the future except there is a mistake and they end up in the past traveling through history trying to get back home. It will explore history and have these two beautiful, intelligent female characters.

LR: Have you pitched it yet?

AT: Yes, a couple of times. We have a couple different producers who would like to do it. We are dealing with contracts and lawyers and all that stuff. It's very exciting! Steven Sears, who was executive Producer of Xena and now of Sheena, has said he wants to do it. Has agreed to if we want him. So, we are in the middle of all that and I am really excited.

LR: It's a great premise for a show and sounds very interesting, almost like Quantum Leap meets Xena. AT: Thank-you.

LR: Will there be any Lesbian subtext in the show? AT: Have you been to the web site? www.hourglass1.com

LR: Yes...I've seen it.

AT: We have subtext in the web site, baby! I just wrote the pilot episode and I put subtext in. I've also been told that chances are very, very high that no matter how good my pilot was, it will end up getting re-written by whomever we get to produce it. It ultimately has a lot to do with who ends up running the show. I know Sears isn't afraid of that so if we go with him and we (Claudia & Alex) have anything to do with it...

LR: and given your and Claudia's background, the characters you have played...

AT: Yeah. We would like to start where Xena left off and go from there. Also a good chunk of the pilot that I wrote has us on board ship with Anne Bonney and Mary Read, who were probably lovers. Claudia and I really want to make the show, not a feminist revision of history but a revisitation of history. We want to visit important moments where women were in power.

LR: So, the lesbian fan base for Xena never bothered you? AT: Why would it bother me? I think it's wonderful.

LR: I think it kept the show going. **AT**: You are probably right.

LR: Obviously, the same fan base is behind Hourglass already.

AT: (Laughs) Yea, baby! Wait till you see Taboo.

LR: I wanted to ask you about *Taboo*, we just ordered the uncensored version.

AT: It was crazy how it happened. I was having lunch with Claire [Stansfield, who plays Alti on Xena & directed Taboo] and she showed me a printout of stills from the shoot with Claudia [Christian, formerly of Babylon 5] and Katya who is a fan from Finland who is in the video. The stills were beautiful. Claire really knows how to light women and it was so gorgeous. I said, "I'm jealous, I want to be in it."

LR: Be careful what you wish for. AT: Oh yeah! There I was a week later.

LR: What is Taboo about?

AT: It's a music video. The song [sung by Claudia Christian] is about sexual taboos and desires. Claire has a great sense of style and there is another 'fan' in it, a woman whose name is Sebastian, from England. She's gorgeous. She has no hair and you can't really tell what race she is or what gender she is. I had all my scenes with her.

LR: Sounds like you have interesting scenes.

AT: Yea. In the first one I was in a red corset with a blind fold with Sebastian sort of in the background. The next one Claire had me in bright red little boys' underwear and a bright red bra. Then she had me walk around Claudia's house and get my feet all dirty. The shot had me on my hands and knees and you see my dirty feet and little boys' underwear and Sebastian's combat boots in the corner of the frame.

LR: Wow

AT: Yeah, it's pretty sexy! Then we started drinking (laughs) and I asked to hear the music for the video. So, we put on the music, started drinking and Claire told me the camera wasn't on when it was ... and things went from there.

LR: All that's in the video?

AT: Oh yeah, more in the uncensored version.

LR: When did you get a sense of how big Xena was? AT: I had friends who were on the internet hinting at stuff, telling me I had alters and such, but it was my first convention that just blew me away. It was a small one, Rebel Con in Boston. Then I did GenCon and there were 30,000 people and it really did mess with my head. I never get recognized. I don't look anything like Aphrodite in real life especially then I had really short hair. I was shocked.

LR: What is your favorite episode of Xena and why? AT: My favorite episode is *The God you Know*. Because there was such a range for my character. And it was wild to work with Alexis Arquette! One of my most challenging episodes . It was intense. Alexis is amazing both on and off screen. For example, there was this little room where we had to wait to go on and we were all there, me, Rene, Alexis and 4 half dressed slave guys. Alexis was holding court with the guys and I was in the corner trying to cry for a scene. It was crazy.

LR: Whose idea was it for Aphrodite to kiss Gabrielle? AT: I don't know. One of the writers, I guess. (grinning) It was fun! It was a hard scene to shoot though. You can't tell from the way they shot it but I was crying and that's a lot in one scene. To be crying and laughing and telling a girl that you are so in love with a guy and then trying to make out with that same girl 2 seconds later.

LR: Besides Xena, what have you done that you are the most proud of?

AT: Umm... Sunchaser, which is a movie I did a few years ago with Woody Harrelson that Michael Cimino, directed. It went to the Cannes Film Festival, did really well in France. It did horrible in America. Nobody ever saw it, which is why you haven't heard of it. I liked my work in that movie and I liked working with Cimino as a director. It was the real deal. Also, it was a really different experience from doing fast turnaround television. That's satisfying. A lot more than doing a scene twice and moving on.

LR: What are you doing now, other that *Hourglass*? AT: Hourglass is taking up most of my time. I just did an episode of Sheena that will be on this fall. Claudia and I did a sci-fi audio book called *Anne Manx and the Ring of the*

Minotaur.

LR: You mentioned onstage earlier shooting a pilot in Vancouver. What was that?

AT: I did! It didn't get picked up. It was for UPN and was not picked up. It was a lot of fun. I got to learn to use a butterfly knife for that and I am pretty good at it now. I love weapons! It is so weird, I went to Quaker School for 14 years and yet I love fighting and weapons.


LR: What was your favorite TV show growing up? AT: (Without hesitation) Charlie's Angels. I got to visit the set when I was 7 years old and I sat in Cheryl Ladd's chair. It was so cool! So COOL!

LR: What does the future hold for you?

AT: I want Hourglass to go into production this fall, shoot in Montreal or Europe so I can learn another language, be wildly successful, run for 5 years and become a springboard to all the other things I want to do. Acting, directing, writing, producing...To be able to work and create with my posse of talented friends. We push and challenge each other to do ground breaking stuff. I love working with women; I like working with men too. I like them all. I'm a slut.

LR: What one thing do you want fans to remember about you as Aphrodite?

AT: Laughter and that it was all about the love.



Out in Vancouver with Dyke Porn Auteurs Shar Rednour and Jackie Strano

A filmmaker, usually a director, who exercises creative control over his or her works and has a strong personal style.

Diva. Porn Star. Reverend. Rock Star. Femmepres. Pornographer. Shar Rednour and Jackie Strano would make anyone curious and they cause one to form plenty of preconceptions.

Shar Rednour is a performance artist, editor and bestselling author of The Femme's Guide to the Universe and Starf*cker (both from Alyson Books) as well as creating the erotic Virgin Territory series. She has also toured with sister Spit, performed at this year's Michigan women's festival and cut her teeth at the dyke mag On Our Backs.

Jackie Strano is a former worker/owner at Good Vibrations, the famous woman-owned sex store in San Francisco, as well as a published author and founder/frontwoman for the all-dyke hard rock band the Hail Marys.

If these accomplishments were not enough, Shar and Jackie are also the powerhouses behind SIR Video. SIR is the company that produced the dyke porn films Hard Love/How to Fuck in High Heels (2000 AVN award winner for Best All-Girl Feature) and Sugar High, Glitter City, which just had its Canadian Premiere at Vancouver's gay and lesbian film festival Out on Screen.

Shar and Jackie are creating porn that has never been seen before. Porn with butch women, role-playing and erotic power exchange. Porn that celebrates lesbian sex and yet may offend some lesbians. It's real sex with real women. It's honest, groundbreaking, radical and hot.

It was with these things in mind that we approached this interview in Vancouver only to have our preconceptions smashed by two incredible women who touched our lives and just may change the way you look at sex. Here now is the first in our multi-part interview.

LR: Tell us about the Hail Marys.

JS: I started the Hail Marys back in 93. I am the lyricist, lead singer, rhythm guitarist and one of the main songwriters. It used to be mixed, which was cool because we got to play a lot of Gay Pride festivals, but as of 1996 it has been an all dyke rock band. We have toured nationally and internationally if you count our gig at Whistler back in 94 (laughs) are on the soundtrack of Bound and indie festival flicks like My Femme Divine and Hard Love, etc. We have toured regionally, opened for Cyndi Lauper, X, The Delphines, and soon The Butchies besides playing with

other awesome bands. We have played the big clubs here like The Filmore, Slim's and The Paradise Lounge. We have self released 3 CD's, the most recent is a seven song self titled EP. Immediate goals are securing management, distribution, and getting to play in Europe. We are also looking for a new lead guitarist. Former guitarist, Debbie Torrey has left on good terms after 4 years to pursue her college studies and to not have to tour. I also do solo shows of my own songs and stripped down versions of Hail Marys songs I have written. We have upcoming gigs and tour plans and want to promote our newest CD, want to do more soundtracks too. Veronica Savage is the bass player since 1996; Cat Barber has been our drummer since 1998.

JS: I love it. I mean, it doesn't pay the rent but I'll tell you something; I get e-mails from people all over and I answer them myself. I remember when I was younger and I loved a band, I didn't get to talk to them. It's cool. I have a high school girl in Florida who has just come out to her parents, her big dream is to drive cross-country when she graduates from high school, come to California and see the Hail Marys play. It is great to have that instant link. I hate to have the middleman in anything. We are do it ourselves type business people. Of course we'd love to make more money at it. It has kind of been a side project that has sucked a lot of money but it is my passion and my heart.

LR: Shar, tell us a little about Sister Spit.

SR: Sister Spit began in 1994 through the efforts of Sini Anderson and Michelle Tea to bring together talented women and dykes. I started performing with Sister Spit 4 years ago. I am part of about 15 writers that are considered part of the Sister Spit family. Most of us are in the Bay area but not all, like Kathe Izzo is in Province Town and some are in New York. It is fun but it is hard for me to only read for 10 minutes. Most of the women are poets but there are a few of us who are prose.

LR: And the Wasted Motel tour? SR: The Wasted Motel Tour was a tour of baby poets and delinquent Divas. It consisted of Michelle Tea, Kassy Kayiatos, Sash Sunday, Jackie and me.

LR: How did it come about? SR: I had the Femme's Guide out and I wanted to tour it but we didn't have the money and if you just read at bookstores you don't get paid. I was used to doing shows with Sister Spit. It wasn't so much that we wanted to make money but we wanted to make sure we didn't go into the hole for touring. Michelle [Tea] had a new book out, Valencia, and Jackie doesn't read enough in public. Kassy is a youth poet/slam champ. She was the baby: she turned 21 on the tour. Sash Sunday rounded out the tour but she deserted in after the New York show and went to Prague. I think the best part is to inspire other women.

JS: I was bummed about that because she and I did drag during the tour as well. We were the Cajun Carpetmuncher Brothers, pronounced Karpaymonshay. We did really good drag and we actually perform; we don't lip synch. We looked downright frightful. Dykes always thought we were in the wrong bar. We would be all strapped and dressed and go to the

club and dykes would be like, "I don't think so!" Then we would have to tell them that we were part of the night's act. Our whole schtick was that these songs were stolen from us while we were in rehab and we have come back to claim our hits; then we do Eagle's numbers and stuff like that.

LR: Was response to the tour good? SR: It was great. It was fabulous. JS: We had a blast. Sometimes the places that were a little off the beaten path really surprised us with how cool they were.

LR: Now, on to the good stuff. The AVN awards. For those who don't know, can you explain what they are and why it was such a huge deal to be nominated and win?

JS: AVN, Adult Video News, produces an issue every month that reviews adult movies, tells retailers what to stock and gives updates on what is going on in the world of adult films. It is industry rag really but a lot of fans read it as well. Every year they put on an awards show, just like the academy awards, and the awards are voted on by people in the industry. (Producers, actors, directors etc.)

LR: It must be hard to get nominated. JS: There are huge amounts of money put behind campaigns for these films. It is very intense competition.

SR: There are technical awards as well as awards for best girl/girl scene, best group scene...

JS: So, we don't have the money to lobby or take out full page ads but we sent it [the film] to them because we are in the business and we wanted them to see what we are doing. They loved it. They gave us a full page, Editor's Choice review; then we got nominated for Best All-Girl Scene and Best All-Girl Feature and came home with one award.

SR: It's funny. We won for best all-girl feature but to be nominated for best al-girl scene is almost a bigger deal. First of all, it used to be a specialty to

have a girl/girl scene in a movie but now there is a girl/girl scene in almost every movie. We're talking about 10,000 scenes and WE get nominated. In addition to that it was Jackie and CC Belle's scene in Hard Love so you have a scene with a butch woman. **JS**: It was a big deal.

SR: there is a lot of cheesy, bad porn out there but there is some good stuff. Some stuff shot on film with great directors, big budgets and editing studios so we were pleased by that nomination alone.

JS: We just thought we were gonna go party. We love Vegas and wanted to gamble and have fun. We brought our friends with us and were in a room with a huge tub in the middle.So here's this crowd of dykes going into this thing. I mean we're all tattooed and pierced with colored hair and the butches were wearing their suits. But we walked in and were totally accepted. They were just like, "The freaks are here! Woo hoo!"

SR: We are the fringe of the fringe in that group it was very interesting.

JS: It was nice for this alternative, tiny women owned company who is really on the outside of the industry to be given the nod by the mainstream was nice.

SR: I think that the thing that was important about the award as well was that our little movie and the fact that the sex in it was so authentic and so earnest and really sexy speaks volumnes. That's what they really look for. There are really good people at AVN who are serious and it's not just about who bought the biggest ad. Whether it is gay, straight or lesbian they look for people enjoying sex.

LR: Did any of the big distributors approach you after that?

JS: Yeah, we've gotten contacted by

some of the big boys but they think we are going to sell them a buch for \$5 or whatever. We can't survive like that. We are a two person company and we don't want to bite off more than we can chew.

SR: The film has been successful. Considering the company is just me and Jackie and there are lots of women who don't know about the film yet and can't go to their local store and get it.

JS: We live off our company and everything we make goes back into production of more movies. But we are doing ok. We went into the profit margin...

SR: I predicted a year and it took 9 months. The thing is. I used to work for Fatale Video and I knew from those days, that the distributors want ridiculous prices so I warned Jackie when we went into this and steaady but we can't git it away to distributors. This is a specialty product. I told one distributor that what he was asking was like asking for the hand blown glass earrings for the same price as the ones you get at Wal-Greens. I wear everything from trash to treasure but one is different from the other. These are not massproduced and we only make one film a year.

JS: We really created our own niche market and there isn't anything else like it out there right now. We started as a production company and kind of fell into the distribution.

SR: We aren't intimidated by the distributors though so..

LR: Has it been hard to find talent?

SR: Thank god we live in the SF Bay area! There are a bevy of beautiful dykes who are exibitionists.

JS: Willing talent. **SR**: The more movies we do the more talent we find.

JS: Exactly. Now people are coming to us. We have a whole list of folks to interview for the next production.

LR: Do you always have the same crew?

JS: We've worked with the same folks for every production. We all do everything.

LR: It was interesting watching the credits of both films and seeing everyone's name pop up again and again doing other things for the film. JS: Totally, we all wear a million hats

What a Word's Worth

Glass Houses

Ciearan Llachlan Leavitt (Renaissance Alliance Publishing, Inc., 1999/2001) **Tropical Storm** *Melissa Goo*d (Justice House Publishing, 2000)

What a strange experience it was to read Melissa Good's *Tropical Storm* followed immediately by *Glass Houses* by Victoria author, Ciaran Llachlan Leavitt. Leavitt's novel was inspired by Good's and closely echoes *Tropical Storm* in both substance and form.

Tropical Storm is a novel about a toughas-nails corporate raider, Dar Roberts, whose career involves taking over small IT companies. Whether acquired staff are absorbed or fired is of no consequence to Dar who cares only for the bottom line. Her takeover of Associated Synergenics doesn't go quite as smoothly as she is used to when she comes up against Associated manager, Kerry Stuart. Stuart is smart, attractive, loyal to her people, and so gosh-darn 'nice' she made my teeth hurt. Needless to say, some serious "opposites attract" dynamics follow, and the two women face a myriad of challenges as they become more and more passionately involved.

Leavitt's novel is about a workaholic filmmaker who winds up directing a film based on the novel *Tropical Storm*. The lead actress hired to play the ruthless Dar Roberts is a wonderfully flawed, homophobic woman hiding from a plethora of demons she keeps locked away in her own well-barricaded closet.

Leavitt's director, Jae Cavanaugh, follows the *Tropical Storm* plot quite faithfully as she attempts to create a wonderful movie that will further her career in Hollywood. It is most disconcerting to hear Jae discussing dialogue (as written in the novel, *Tropical Storm*) with her lead actress, Reed, who is (in



Glass Houses) busily reading Tropical Storm as filming is underway. This clever layering fiction over fiction creates the most peculiar illusion of truth and left me feeling as if I had stumbled in on some bizarre movie set in which I was both a participant and observer. Glass Houses is the more complex and subtle of the two novels, though at times it feels like Leavitt is intentionally messing with readers' heads as she has director and actress analyze how best to bring Good's characters to life. The interpersonal dynamics between director, Jae, and actress, Reed, are more interesting than the goings on between Dar and Kerry in Tropical Storm. Reed and Jae are sometimes predictable and boring. I found the back-story and motivations of Leavitt's characters to be more plausible than Good's. In Tropical Storm, both Kerry and Dar seemed too pat, their turnarounds too tidy. Kerry's background didn't quite ring true (extremely dysfunc-

tional families tend to produce dysfunctional kids and Kerry is, well, too darned nice). Towards the end of Glass Houses Leavitt writes some very convincing and powerful emotional material as we see the actress, Reed, struggling to come to terms with the inner conflicts caused by the discordance between years of homophobia/people-who-say-they-loveme-just-want-to-use-me conditioning and her powerful feelings for Jae. The main characters in Glass Houses grow and change in convincing ways and of the two sets of protagonists, I cared more about Leavitt's and found their story to be more believable, interesting, and compelling.

Both books use alternating points of view as the narrative flips back and forth

between the main characters. I'm not a fan of this technique. I'd rather get inside the head of one character with which I can form a strong emotional attachment instead of constantly jumping back and forth between leads. In both books (and particularly in Tropical Storm) it is sometimes hard to tell who is speaking, as the voices of the lead characters are, at times, too similar. I don't know whether Leavitt made the decision to use the same alternating point of view as Good because she liked it or because she was imitating Good's style. Either way, neither author managed to totally overcome the built-in shortcomings of this format.

Both novels had lots of enjoyable fifth business. Having lived in Florida for a time, it was fun to see references to local hangouts in Tropical Storm (some of which are revisited when the film crew in Glass Houses travels to Florida for some location filming). By the same token, Leavitt does a good job of evoking the craziness of the film industry. Neither plot is really strong enough to sustain 400+ pages of narrative - both of these novels could have been cut by a third and we wouldn't have missed some of the filler and repetition. That said, if you've got some time on your hands, grab a copy of each and lose yourself in this peculiar art-imitating-art-imitatingart pair of novels. For best results, read Tropical Storm first.

Vriend Decision Detour

King's University College is attempting an end run around the Supreme Court of Canada decision that led to changes in Alberta's regulatory stance on Queer rights.

The college is the fundamentalist Christian school that went to court and lost after it fired Delwin Vriend because he had come out. Not only did Vriend win his suit against the school, but also the case and the homophobic response it precipitated across Alberta inspired the provincial government to extend human rights protection to Queers.

Now King's is trying to ban Queers indirectly with a new code of conduct; it has no mention of lesbians or gays, but does prohibit "sex outside marriage" as well as things like using illegal drugs

or swearing.

Queer Partnerships Recognized

A Saskatchewan omnibus bill that received royal assent in July recognizes same-gender partnerships and amends 24 provincial laws to give Queer couples adoption rights, public pension benefits ... the same rights as any other couple.

Saskatchewan is the sixth province to comply with a Supreme Court decision two years ago that provincial laws must give same-gender couples the same legal rights as married and

heterosexual common-law couples.

Or Not

As more U.S. states start recognizing Queer partnerships, two right-wing Christian groups think they have a way to stop the evolution. The Traditional Values Coalition and Focus On the Family want a constitutional ammendment banning samegender marriage.

Coalition chair Rev. Louis Sheldon says the ammendment is required because of the "barrage" of attacks on family values. "There was Hawaii, then you had Alaska, then you had Vermont. We see the writing on the wall," Sheldon says. "Our founding fathers never anticipated this. We definitely need to take this to the people. That's what a constitutional amendment would be." The ammendment, which has been endorsed by Senator Jesse Helms, would need to be adopted by two-thirds of U.S. states to take effect. More than 30 states have already passed laws specifically prohibiting same-gender unions. Missouri joined that list in July with legislation that not only bans Queer marriage in the state, but also refuses to recognize same-gender union ceremonies performed out of state (i.e., Vermont).

Dolphin Diversity

Brazilian scientists have documented homosexual behavior among dolphins.

The team of marine experts was studying dolphins at an archipelago off the northeastern coast, with a particular interest in their reproductive behaviour. They were surprised when they observed homosexual behavior among both males and females. The scientists are now looking for environmental anomalies to

"explain" the dolphins' Queer behaviour.

ITV Pumps Alpha

Britain's Independent Television network is broadcasting a 10part documentary about Alpha, an evangelical Christian recruitment program based on the claim that Queers can choose to become straight. ITV has so far not agreed to give any Queer organzation equal time.

The documentary is "the biggest Christian propaganda campaign ever seen on British TV," according to the Gay and Lesbian Humanist Association.

The Alpha course preaches that homosexuality is a sin and that Queers will go to Hell. Dr George Carey, the Archbishop of Canterbury, says it's "a wonderful tool for the Christian faith."

The Score

A New Jersey court has ruled that trannies are protected under state anti-discrimination laws even if the laws don't specifically say so.

Tuscon warns it will cut off it's \$1.5 million annual contribution to the United Way unless the organization formally respects trannies' rights. That would prevent discrimination against trannies among United Way agencies, unless they decided to forego United Way funding.

Romania has decriminalized Queer relationships between consenting adults. Previous laws imposed jail terms of up to five years for homosexual behaviour. The Romanian government made the move because it wants membership in the European Union. The EU and the Council of Europe had denounced Romania's sex laws as a breach of human rights.

Same-gender marriages have been legal since Aug. 1 in Germany. German officials have been swamped with licence applications.

Korea recently adopted an Internet rating system to protect the public from "harmful" sites and almost immediately shut down www.ivancity.com because it served the Queer community. The government's filtering system is also blocking other Queer sites from outside Korea.








Good Night, Old Friend

On a hot July day in 1989, I was introduced to a black and tan Lab/Shepherd puppy. She was perfectly square, all feet and tail, and full of spit and vinegar. In the backyard of our house in Sharonville, she puttered about, snuffling and leaping at grasshoppers and leaves. Backing up for an especially tough jump, she ran her round bottom into a miniature rose bush. With a yelp, she whipped around, and in seconds flat gnawed the offender to the ground. There was nothing for it — we had to take her. We lived in that house for six years, and she never let that bush grow more than a foot high.

Andy named her "Beast" - to the outraged cries of his family, and Beast she was. For 12 years she graced our home with laughter and mud, bringing in old socks, dead leaves and the occasional stray puppy. She never got huge, as her paws had suggested she might, and she never did learn to come when she was interested in something else. She ate Barbie doll arms down to the elbows, and chewed every pair of women's underwear she could snarf. When she was young, she learned that she could climb the chain-link fence, and from that point on, the only reason for the fence was to keep other dogs out.

She had a tortoise-shell cat named Checkers, who died in 1998 of cancer. Whenever we wanted to keep Checkers in line, we'd call out, "Beastie, where's the kitty?" and Beast would leap up, chase the cat down, and step on her head. She loved this game — Checkers was less than enamoured of it. When Checkers died, Beast went through all the rooms looking for her for a month. She even tipped over the garbage, not eating anything, just trying to find her old friend.

I'm a great one for a party, so we entertained a lot. Beast was the perfect dog for that, greeting everyone at the door with enthusiasm, then going to lie down at my feet. She never stole food from the table or the plate, though if offered, she was far too polite to decline. She loved peanut butter, maybe even more than meat, and the only time she begged was if we were eating peanut butter toast. Until Andy introduced her to the joys of Ruffles Potato Chips. It was all-downhill from there.



Although she loved every member of the family with gusto, she was my dog. She followed me everywhere, underfoot and in the way. She slept on or under or beside my bed, and in thunderstorms came to wake me with her terrified panting and a paw on my arm. We often talked long and earnestly to each other, with eye contact and nose contact and the occasional tongue contact (never MY idea). She knew when I was unhappy, and when I was getting ready to go on a trip. She lay under my legs when I sat on the couch; both of us content to just be together.

Beastie didn't do well with other dogs or fleas, being unhappy whenever she was in the presence of either. She was unpleasant enough with other dogs that she was never off her leash the last few years. Her flea allergy was bad enough that we almost lost her a few times, and she would look like a mangy cur by the end of summer. This past year, we noticed her weight was lessening, and she seemed to be coughing more. A checkup at the vet's in June showed an enlarged heart, enlarged liver, arthritis throughout her spine, and cancer. Rick (our wonderful vet) thought she wouldn't make it to the end of the month, but being Beastie, she fooled us all.

This evening, at 6:15, Beast lay down in our arms and died. Rick spent lots of time with us first, explaining the procedure, talking about making the best choices, and where her ashes would go. When he pulled the needle out, he whispered, "There you go, no more sick." I am so grateful to him for his thoughtfulness, but the ache in my heart, and the empty place beside my bed are going to cause me a lot of pain for the next while. I loved my old girl, and I'll miss her forever. I know, however, that she's running free, without a leash, stepping on the cat's head and biting down rose bushes.

Goodnight old friend. We'll meet again.






